THE MISSION

KICS is a free self-defense outreach program designed to address the three-fold needs of children: body, mind, and spirit.

THE MARTIAL ARTS

Tae Kwon Do is an ancient Korean martial art. It is taught at FBC as a self-defense program to discipline the body and mind for the glory of God. Children are instructed never to use it as an aggressive offense or attack towards others; teaching them confidence to avoid aggression.

THE MESSAGE

The most important feature of this program is the spiritual aspect. God’s Word, the Bible, is taught as part of the class instruction. It is God’s message of hope and love, possible only through the sacrificial death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. When trusted for salvation, Jesus redeems us from our sin.

THE MENTOR

KICS is taught by Miss Jane Parr, a qualified teacher in Tae Kwon Do. Her faithful passion for God and kids moved her to begin the program five years ago. Students from the beginning have moved up in the class and help mentor other students.

PARENTS

Parents are vital to the success of the students by reinforcing the tenets of the class. They are even welcome to stay and observe the classes. At the end of the KICS season the parents, family and friends are invited to watch the kids demonstrate the skills they have been acquired.

KICS is a free ministry of First Baptist Church. All children ages 5 and older are welcome to attend. Registration providing personal information, insurance, and release of liability must be completed before children participate (below).

TAE KWON DO CODE OF CONDUCT

In order to provide optimal safety, learning, fun, and martial artist conduct, please observe the following at all times:

- Upon arrival prior to class, remove shoes and socks and place neatly along wall near drinking fountain. Quietly begin stretching or practicing forms or techniques. No use of equipment, running around, or sparring with one another is allowed before or after class. This is a quiet time.
- Show respect at all times to classmates, instructors, and facilities. This includes refraining from talking in class and horseplay. Respect one another during practice of techniques, allow for your partner to practice.
- Do not wear jewelry, chew gum, or bring food, drinks, or toys to class. Your uniform and belt identifies you as a martial artist and makes your rank known. It is your responsibility to keep it clean and intact (not mom's!).
- Remember to practice respect outside of class as well. Being the aggressor by performing Tae Kwon Do on schoolmates, friends or family members is not respectful and is prohibited. Set a good example for others to follow.
- The parking lot area is for cars. For safety, wait inside the building until your ride arrives. No playing or running around in the parking lot or outside the building before or after class.
- When class is over, quietly put on shoes then sit down in the foyer/entranceway and wait to be picked up. (Class begins at 7pm and ends at 8pm).
- Variance for the rules will result in removal from class to sit with the adults in the prayer and Bible study taking place in the sanctuary.
